Overview

The Levoit Classic 160 is a straightforward, reliable humidifier built for small to medium rooms (up to 219 square feet). Because it relies on a physical control knob rather than a digital screen, it operates completely dark—making it highly recommended for nurseries and light-sensitive sleepers. It utilizes an ultrasonic transducer to turn water into a fine cool mist, offering up to 25 hours of continuous runtime on its lowest setting.

Safety Warnings

Read these manufacturer warnings before plugging in your device. Ignoring these can permanently damage the electronics or create a fire hazard.

- **No Essential Oils:** Never add essential oils, vapor rubs, or supplemental water treatments into the water tank or base chamber. This will crack the BPA-free plastic and cause immediate leaks.
- **Never Pour Water in the Base:** Only fill the humidifier from the top of the water tank. Pouring water directly into the bottom base chamber or down the center mist tube will destroy the device.
- **Keep Away from Walls:** The mist nozzle must be directed away from walls, furniture, and electrical appliances to prevent moisture damage.
- **Surface Requirements:** Always place the unit on a hard, flat, water-resistant surface at least 12 inches away from any wall. Do not place it directly on carpets or rugs, which can block airflow.

Quick Setup & Use Steps

1. Remove all packaging tape from the outside of the humidifier.
2. Lift the water tank off the base and remove the tape securing the internal float.
3. Check that the pre-installed water filter sponge is locked in place inside the tank.
4. Place the base on a hard, water-resistant table at least 12 inches from the wall.
5. Remove the top cover and fill the tank with room-temperature distilled water.
6. Replace the cover, plug the cord into a polarized outlet, and rotate the knob clockwise until it clicks on.

(Note: The Classic 160 is a standalone model and does not have trim variants or smart-app versions under this specific model number.)

Operating Instructions

- **Powering On:** Rotate the infinity control knob clockwise. You will hear an audible click as the machine turns on.
- **Adjusting Mist:** Continue turning the knob clockwise to increase the mist output (up to 190ml/h), or counter-clockwise to reduce it.
- **Directing Mist:** Spin the 360-degree rotating nozzle on the top cover to point the mist precisely where you want it.
- **Powering Off:** Rotate the knob fully counter-clockwise until it clicks to turn the machine completely off.

List of Terms

Base Chamber

The bottom half of the humidifier that houses the electronics and the transducer. Water drops into this area from the tank to be vaporized.

Mist Tube

The hollow pipe running up the center of the water tank. Mist travels up this tube to exit the nozzle.

Float

A small mechanical piece in the base that rises and falls with the water level to trigger the auto shut-off safety feature.

Water Filter Sponge

A small pre-installed sponge that catches large debris and minerals before water hits the base chamber.

Error Codes & Troubleshooting

Because the Levoit Classic 160 relies on an analog knob rather than a digital display, it does not produce digital error codes (such as E1 or E2). Instead, it communicates issues physically or via a single indicator light.

Problem / Indicator	Meaning	Solution
Solid Red Light	Low Water / Auto Shut-Off. The float in the base has dropped, triggering the safety shut-off.	Turn the knob off, unplug the unit, and refill the water tank. The light will turn off when the tank is filled.
No Mist Coming Out	Flooded Base. There is too much water in the base chamber, preventing the ultrasonic transducer from working.	Unplug the machine. Remove the tank, empty the base chamber completely, and reassemble. Never pour water directly into the base.
White Dust on Furniture	Hard Water Minerals. The humidifier is atomizing heavy minerals found in standard tap water.	Empty the tank, descale with white vinegar, and switch to using strictly purified or distilled water.

FAQs

How do I clean and descale the Levoit Classic 160?

You should clean the tank every three days and descale it when you see mineral buildup. Remove the water tank, fill it with 3 cups (710 mL) of distilled white vinegar, swish it around, and let it soak on the base for 15-20 minutes. Scrub gently with a soft brush, then rinse all parts thoroughly with clean water.

Are the Levoit Classic 160 parts dishwasher safe?

Yes, but only specific parts. The water tank, top cover, mist tube, and filter housing are dishwasher safe as long as the water temperature stays below 158°F (70°C). Never place the base chamber in the dishwasher, as water will instantly destroy the electronics.

How often should I change the filter sponge?

Levoit recommends replacing the water filter sponge every month, though this depends heavily on the hardness of your water. If the sponge looks visibly dirty or stiff, it is time to change it. You can find official replacements by searching for SKU B09ZY9N6PD.

Do I have to use distilled water?

While tap water works, Levoit strongly recommends using purified or distilled water. Using tap water will result in white mineral dust settling on your furniture and will require you to descale the machine much more frequently.
